## PHLEBOTOMY PROGRAM

### PROGRAM DETAILS

The Phlebotomy Full course program is in person. The classroom portion is 4-10 weeks long, depending on the class schedule chosen, with the externship schedule at the end of classroom instruction. The program will include the following components:

1. **Phlebotomy Basic Didactic:** Total of 20 hours of didactic instruction in Basic Phlebotomy
2. **Phlebotomy Advanced Didactic:** Total of 20 hours of didactic instruction in Advanced Phlebotomy
3. **Phlebotomy In-Class Training:** 40-60 classroom hours of applied phlebotomy where students are introduced to various blood-withdrawal devices and begin to develop skills and techniques in the art of phlebotomy
4. **National Exam:** 1 Phlebotomy Technician national exam sitting with a CDPH approved national certifying organization is included with the program. Students must pass the National Exam to proceed with a clinical externship.
5. **Clinical Externship/Practical Training:** 40-120 hours spent in the clinical environment, at an affiliated medical facility, interacting with patients and other members of the healthcare team. During this segment, the student is expected to demonstrate proficiency in the use of various phlebotomy devices while obtaining blood samples from different categories of patients.

### IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS AND DISCLOSURES

We advise that all scholars complete these required immunizations prior to completing their Human Touch Healthcare course to ensure that they are ready for enrollment. For those who have not been immunized, this process could take up to 6 months.

This program requires that students submit their proof of immunization by the **3<sup>rd</sup> week** of the Program. Students will need to submit the following:

- MMR (Measles, Mumps & Rubella) – You must submit one of the following:
  - Proof of 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine
  - Positive titers for MMR
  - Signed MMR Declination Form\*
- Varicella – You must submit one of the following:
  - Proof of 1 or 2 doses of Varicella vaccine
  - Positive titer for Varicella
  - Signed Varicella Declination Form\*
- Hepatitis B – You must submit one of the following:
  - Proof of 1, 2 or 3 doses of Hep B vaccine
  - Positive titer for Hep B
  - Signed Hep B Declination Form\*
- TDAP – You must submit one of the following:

\*Please note that any of the information listed above is subject to change

- Proof of TDAP within the last 10 years (not TD or dTAP)
- Signed TDAP Declination Form\*
  
- COVID – You must submit one of the following:
  - Proof of 1, 2 or 3 doses of the Pfizer, Moderna or J&J COVID vaccine
  - Signed COVID Declination Form\*
- Seasonal Flu – You must submit one of the following:
  - Only required if completing an externship during flu season (November – March)
  - Signed Flu Declination Form
- Negative Annual TB Test – You must submit one of the following:
  - Negative Annual PPD TB Skin Test
  - Negative Annual QuantiFERON Gold
  - T-spot TB Blood Test
  - If you have a known history of having a positive PPD TB Skin Test or QuantiFERON Gold or T-Spot TB Blood Test, you must submit proof of a cleared Chest X-Ray within the last year

*\*Some externship sites will not accept Declination waivers. Your externship site options may be limited. If you have a preferred externship site, please contact the Admin office to confirm what prerequisites are required to be considered.*

**Please note:** All scholars may be asked to show proof of immunizations required by the clinical sites and some programs with onsite coursework prior to enrollment or an externship.

## EXTERNSHIP DISCLOSURES

Externship is an integral part of program completion and scholars will need to adhere to PhlebotomyU's Externship requirements. Each externship site dictates the requirements students need to submit to be eligible for placement. Students who choose to sign the vaccine Declination Form for any vaccines will find their externship site options will be limited.

The clinical externship opportunity is offered to eligible students within 30 days of classroom instruction. Students who fail to begin the externship after 30 days of classroom instruction will be required to be re-evaluated by an instructor prior to finalizing an externship placement.

The following will be required by PhlebotomyU in order to be eligible for externship placement:

- Cleared Background Check & Drug Screen
  - Instructions on how to sign up will be given on the first day of class.
- Immunizations Requirements (as listed above)
- Recommended Prerequisites
- BLS Certificate
  - If you are interested in a placement at [Scripps or San Ysidro Health](#), they require students to provide a current BLS certificate from an AHA certified organization.
  - Most healthcare facilities will require you to obtain a BLS certificate upon employment and AHA certified BLS certificate should be a universally accepted type of certification.
  - We recommend our students use [iMaster CPR](#) who gives our students a discount off the course.

## PROGRAM AND LAB SCHEDULES

The Phlebotomy Full Course consists of 140 hours of in-person training. PhlebotomyU has multiple schedule options for the Phlebotomy program. The schedules are as follows:

- Weekday Morning: 4 weeks
  - Monday – Friday from 8:00AM to 1:00PM
- Weekday Evening: 5 weeks
  - Monday – Friday from 5:30PM to 9:30PM
- Weekend Morning: 10 weeks
  - Saturdays & Sundays 8:00AM to 1:00PM

Please note that not all course schedules will be available for every start date, and they are subject to change.

**Clinical Externship Schedule:** Externships require a 40–120-hour commitment. The schedule consists of 8-hour shifts, Monday – Friday during normal business hours ranging from 7:00AM to 5:00PM. Specific dates will be discussed with the Admin staff when all prerequisites are met.

## ENROLLMENT DISCLOSURES

After your successful registration for the course through Futuro Health, PhlebotomyU will require the following:

- **Must be at least 18 years of age**
  - Provide a valid Government Issued Photo ID that indicates date of birth (e.g. Driver's License or Passport)
- **Proof of U.S. High School Education or Equivalent** - Must submit one of the following:
  - Copy of High School or accredited college transcript (official or unofficial)
  - Proof of passing the GED, HiSET or CHSPE exams
  - If your education is outside the U.S., please see below for further instructions on what is required
  - Post-secondary or vocational school certificates and transcripts are not acceptable

## STUDENT OUT OF POCKET COSTS

Futuro Health covers the cost of tuition for your full Phlebotomy program, however, there will be some out-of-pocket costs required from the scholar for enrollment.

- Uniform (Black scrubs and closed-toed shoes)
- BLS Certification for Healthcare providers from an AHA certified organization
- Health Requirements (immunizations, TB testing, etc.)
- CDPH CPT application fee

## CAREER SERVICES

## POLICIES

### Uniform:

Student will be required to wear Black scrubs and closed toed shoes. Shoes can be any color but must completely enclose the toes and heels.

### Failure to Begin or Complete a Clinical Externship:

The clinical externship opportunity is offered to eligible students within 30 days of classroom instruction. Unless otherwise discussed with an administrator, students who fail to begin the externship after 30 days of classroom instructions may be required to repeat the classroom practical sessions of the course to be re-evaluated by an instructor. Additional fees may apply.

Students who begin and fail to complete their originally scheduled externship or students who have not been scheduled an externship after 180 days (6 months) of classroom instruction due to missing requirements, student unavailability and/or lack of communication will forfeit the externship included in their tuition. Should the student wish to continue with the course, they will be required to repeat the In-Class Phlebotomy Training portion of the course and re-apply for a clinical externship. Additional fees will apply.

### In-Class Exams:

Final examinations are given at the end of the Basic Didactic, Advanced Didactic and In-Class Phlebotomy Training portions to ensure that each student has acquired sufficient information and knowledge to successfully pass the National Exam and participate in a clinical externship. The In-class exam must be passed with a score of 70% or better and students must obtain a "Pass" for In-Class Phlebotomy Training Evaluations. **Failure of more than one exam or evaluation will result in an Incomplete.**

Completion of Phlebotomy Full Course program constitutes successful completion of the classroom portion and clinical externship. Upon completion of the Phlebotomy Full course, graduates will be Nationally Certified through NCCT/MMCI and will be eligible to apply for a Certified Phlebotomy Technician I (CPT I) license from the California Department of Public Health CDPH).
